Connection to Archeology Viewed from the Documents Included in 'Reitokaku-Shukocho': On the Study of Weapon-shaped Objects of the Yayoi Period

In this paper, I have examined weapon-shaped objects of the Yayoi period included in 'Reitokaku-Shukocho', and clarified the provenances and archaeological features of them. I pointed out that in compiling 'Reitokaku-Shukocho', documents were collected through various media, but associated with information transmission, various skills of copying, changes, omissions, confusions had occurred. I organized the changes in antiquarian activities, and positioned 'Reitokaku-Shukocho' is one of the earliest achievements of antiquarian hobby and collection, which was promoted by Yoshida Doka in close relationship with Tou Teikan during Kansei period at the end of the 18th century.
